Batch: Fourth semester BSc. Nursing, 2022 batch

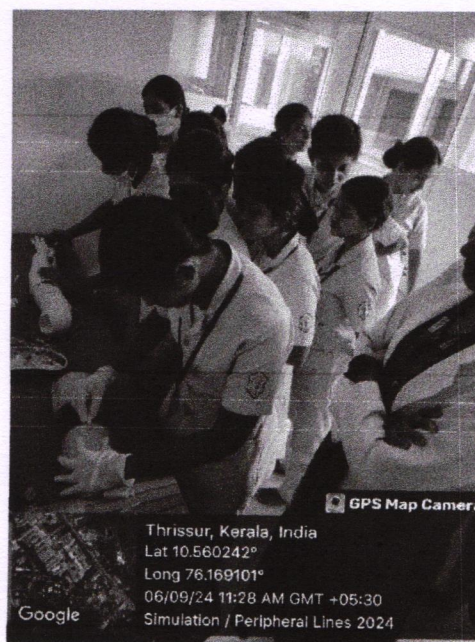
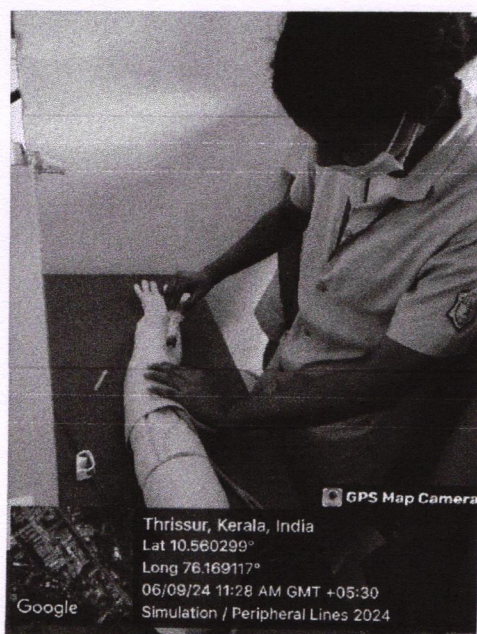
Venue: Skill lab (AIMS)

A simulation-based learning was conducted for the Fourth semester BSc. Nursing, 2022 batch students on IV injection administration, ID injection administration, IM injection site preparation at skill lab (AIMS) under the guidance of Mrs. Shilsa James Assistant Professor, Department of Adult Health Nursing.
