CAREER GUIDANCE PROGRAMMES

OET Training by Ajinorah

Amala College of Nursing organized an OET training program with Ajinorah Global Venture, which took place on February 2, 2024, at 2:30 PM. providing nursing students with the language skills they need professional communication in healthcare settings and that was the goal of the event. Ms. Dina Joseph, Mr. Vibin Wilson, and Ms. Varna Varghese, three skilled OET trainers from Ajinorah Global Venture, led the training sessions. They provided detailed lessons that concentrated on the speaking, writing, listening, and reading sections of the OET test. They discussed the technique of improving language ability and communication skills.

Frame Career

The " Frame Career" comprehensive career guidance program was set up by Amala College of Nursing with the goal of helping students navigate career alternatives and make well-informed judgments regarding their professional pathways. The nurse at Hollymount Private Nursing and Retirement Home, and Ms. Liya Christina Lalan, a Band 5 RN,a 2016 batch alumna, working at Royal Devon University healthcare NHS foundation trust in the United Kingdom. Miss Chithira Jojo, a distinguished Registered Nurse at Active Care Group, UK, and she was also an alumnus of the college, was the resource person for the session. In this session students got an idea about the current state of the UK industry, and resource healthcare the person's explanation of career pathways and skill development was very helpful to the attendees, who also took out valuable advice on how to overcome obstacles and take advantage of opportunities for career advancement. The meeting was quite successful and During the lively questions and answers portion of the program, attendees actively engaged with resource persons to ask questions and get clarification on career-related.

Pre departure programme by NORKA

NORKA pre-departure orientation program was organized in Amala College of Nursing on 27th November 2023 at 1.00 pm. Mrs. Manju Parvathy and Mrs. Indu, esteemed representatives from the Kerala Women's Training Department, adeptly led the session. The main objective of the program was to make aware NORIKA support and resource person well explained the legal support and other welfare measures provided by the students about the requirement needed for migration abroad. Also, it explained about the salary measures, bridge courses, and various exams to be cleared. The students benefitted from a comprehensive understanding of legal, financial, and academic aspects necessary for a successful transition, and their active participation contributed to a fruitful and informative session.

Job Horizons in UK

In the UK, programs for career guidance are essential for helping people make well-informed decisions about their careers. A career guidance program called "Job Horizons" was held by Amala College of Nursing on November 17, 2023, at 8:00 a.m. The program's resource person was Ms. Della VV, a staff nurse band 5, 2021 alumni graduate, who worked in the hyper acute stroke care unit at Charing Cross Hospital, part of the Imperial College NHS Healthcare Trust in London. The objectives of the





program were to enable people to successfully navigate their career paths, make wise decisions to upgrade careers, and provide them with the information and abilities necessary for success in their areas of expertise. The resource person provided a clear explanation of the information regarding opportunities for education and training, a range of industries and career paths, job roles and responsibilities, prospects for advancement, strategies for competitive exams, visa processing, and salary benefits.

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




